Who we are

The International Association of Hydrogeologists (IAH) is a professional association for those within all disciplines related to groundwater. A scientific and educational organisation, IAH's mission is to further the understanding, wise use and protection of groundwater resources throughout the world.

Founded in 1956, we have grown, with the ever increasing social and environmental importance of groundwater, to more than 3800 members in over 130 countries.

We welcome into membership all those, from whatever discipline or level of technical knowledge, who are directly or indirectly engaged in study, research or management of groundwater and want to improve their understanding and support the aims of the Association. Companies and research organisations can apply for corporate membership. We also welcome corporate sponsors.

What we do

Groundwater is not always well understood by the general public, policy makers and professionals in other disciplines. IAH harnesses the research, knowledge, expertise and enthusiasm of its members to help improve this understanding and to promote the professional management of groundwater.

We provide a voice for groundwater in world water policy and to champion its proper use and protection. IAH works with agencies in the UN system, especially UNESCO, FAO, IAEA and WMO, with other waterrelated NGOs and is a member of the World Water Council and UN-Water. IAH is also affiliated to the International Union of Geological Sciences.

We encourage education and technology transfer, improving resources for groundwater professionals in developing countries. This is achieved by building networks of groundwater professionals within and between developing countries, by providing them with up to date technical material and by newsletters.

What we offer

- Rewarding contact with others sharing a common professional interest.
- National and international conferences allowing both a professional and social forum for groundwater specialists.
- Commissions and working groups which focus on particular topics, holding specialist meetings and producing memoirs and reports.

From IAH International

- The Hydrogeology Journal, the official journal of the Association, and one of the major cited international journals dealing with groundwater. Each issue is sent direct to members eight times a year and is also available online.
- Networking opportunities; at meetings and online.
- The option to participate in IAH's mentoring scheme.
- A 60% discount on IAH books from Taylor and Francis, a 20% discount on all Springer-Verlag English-language books, and a 20% discount on all Wiley-Blackwell titles.
- Discounted registration fees at IAH congresses.
- Regular contact and newsletters covering activities in groundwater and within the Association.

From IAH Nationally

The Association has 42 National Chapters and we are always endeavoring to promote more. Some are large and long established; others much newer.

National Chapters provide an opportunity for contact between professionals closer to home. Some chapters circulate national newsletters and maintain websites. Many organise national meetings on groundwater or lead field visits, for which IAH members receive a discount. All act as a much needed voice for groundwater within the national policy arena.

Sponsored membership

IAH operates a sponsored membership scheme, whereby groundwater specialists in low income countries, who do not have the personal resources to join the Association, can be sponsored.
