Seven members are elected for three years each, with the possibility of re-election, representing the geographical, idiomatic, and professional diversity of the country and members. Elections are held by personal voting at yearly General Assembly meetings.

IAH membership status remains more or less stable, while national membership slightly increases continuously.

volunteer time/limitation, IAH fee rates, competition	new/young professionals for our society
from other societies, language, etc.	(e.g. master thesis award), recruitment for concurrent IAH membership is more difficult, particularly regarding colleagues outside research and academia. The IAH fees are significantly higher than the relatively low national membership fees of about 30 Euros only. The 2024 Davos IAH congress might help to increase the membership number this year.

	Since 2021, after Covid, the annual national meetings could be held in presence again. In 2023, it took place the 16/17 of June in the Zurich region, including excursion to nearby sites, and attracted around 80 participants. The General Assembly, however, was hold online again.
